\$400 School Saving Bonus

With the current costs of living, covering supplies and extracurricular activities can be hard on families doing it tough. Uniforms, camps and excursions - it all adds up.

That's why, to help cover these costs, we're providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus to every child at government schools, and eligible students at non-government schools.

Childcare Subsidy

Families must meet eligibility criteria to get CCS. The number of CCS a family can get depends on their circumstances. Services Australia will pay the subsidy directly to your childcare provider to reduce the fees you pay.

Three-and Six-month **Rego Payments**

Pay your registration for 3,6 or 12 months and pay less up front when you choose a 3- or 6-month registration renewal.


